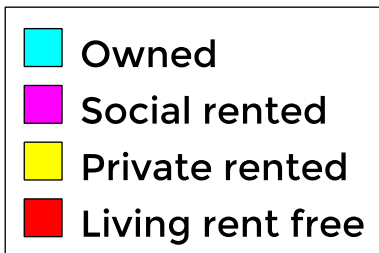
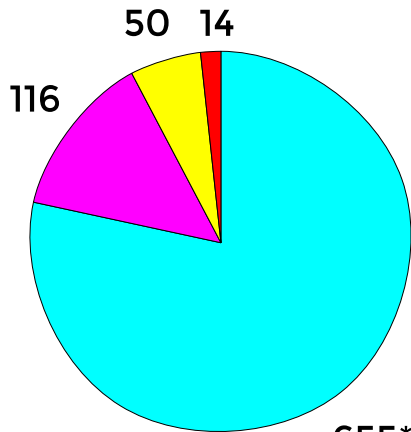


# Housing in Woolpit

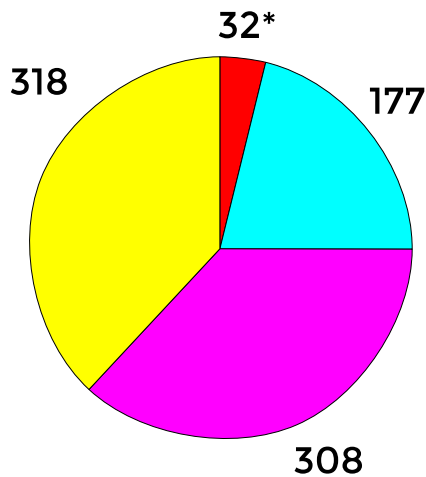
In 2011, there were 835 occupied households in Woolpit.

How does this compare with the rest of Suffolk?

	Woolpit	Mid Suffolk	Suffolk
Owned	78.4%	76.0%	67.9%
Social rented	13.9%	11.2%	14.8%
Private rented	6.0%	11.2%	15.6%
Living rent free	1.7%	1.6%	1.6%

The pattern of tenure in Woolpit is typical of Mid Suffolk; but the rented sector is much smaller than in the rest of the county.

How does this compare with the rest of the country?

1 bedroom	3.8% *	6.1% *	12.0% *
2 bedrooms	21.2%	25.0%	27.9%
3 bedrooms	36.9%	40.4%	41.2%
4+ bedrooms	38.1%	28.5%	18.9%

There is a much higher proportion of large homes in Woolpit than in the district or the country generally. Correspondingly, there are fewer small properties with 1 or 2 bedrooms.

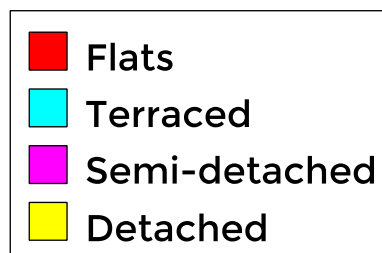
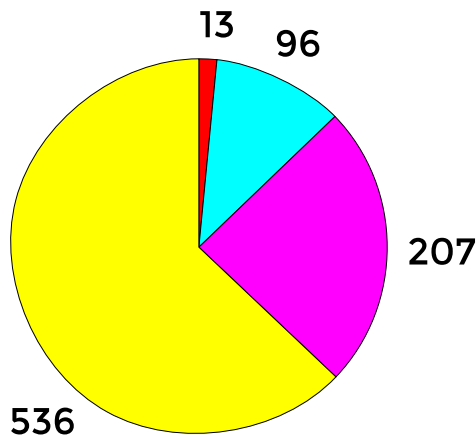
# Housing in Woolpit

How does this compare with the rest of Suffolk?



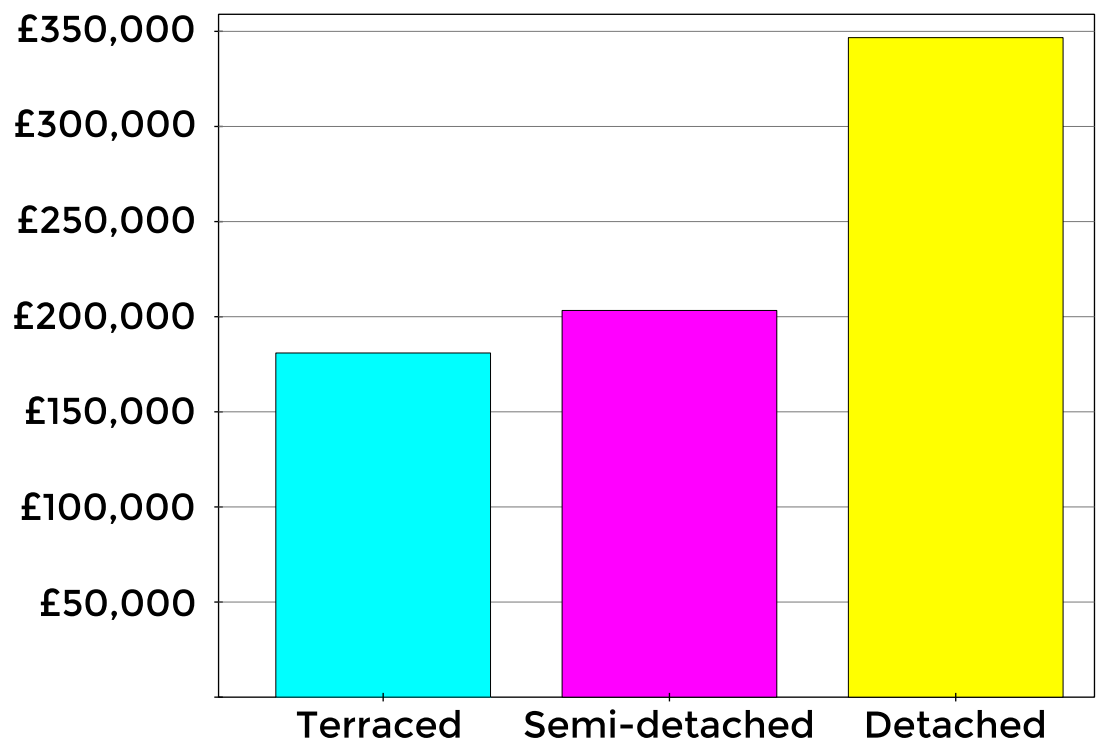
	Woolpit	Mid Suffolk	Suffolk
Flats	1.5%	5.5%	12.1%
Terraced	11.3%	13.7%	22.1%
Semi-detached	24.3%	32.6%	30.5%
Detached	62.9%	47.5%	34.9%

Mid Suffolk and Suffolk also have a very small percentage (<1%) of caravans / mobile homes.

Compared with Mid Suffolk and the rest of the county, Woolpit has fewer flats and terraced houses, which are cheaper to buy (see below).

Average price in September 2015. There were no flats sold at that time. The average price overall was £269,031.

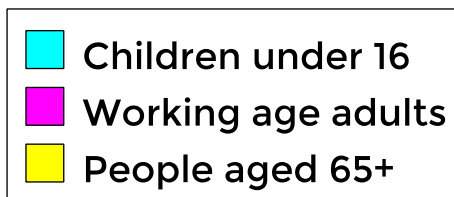
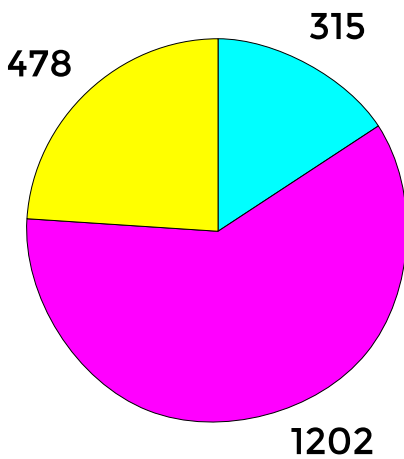
# Living in Woolpit

## How many people live locally?

In 2011, Woolpit had 1995 residents. Of these, nearly one quarter were over 65, and three-fifths were of working age.

65+	24.0%	20.1%	16.3%

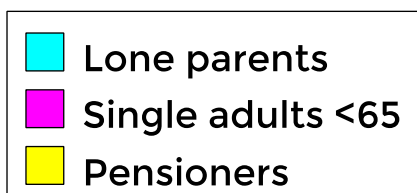
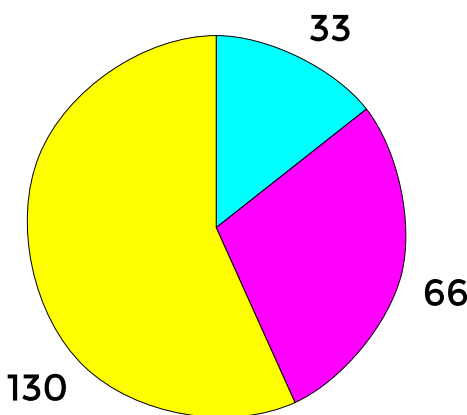
We have more people over 65 than is the average in the district and in England generally.

In 2011, there was a single adult in 229 out of 835 occupied households in Woolpit.

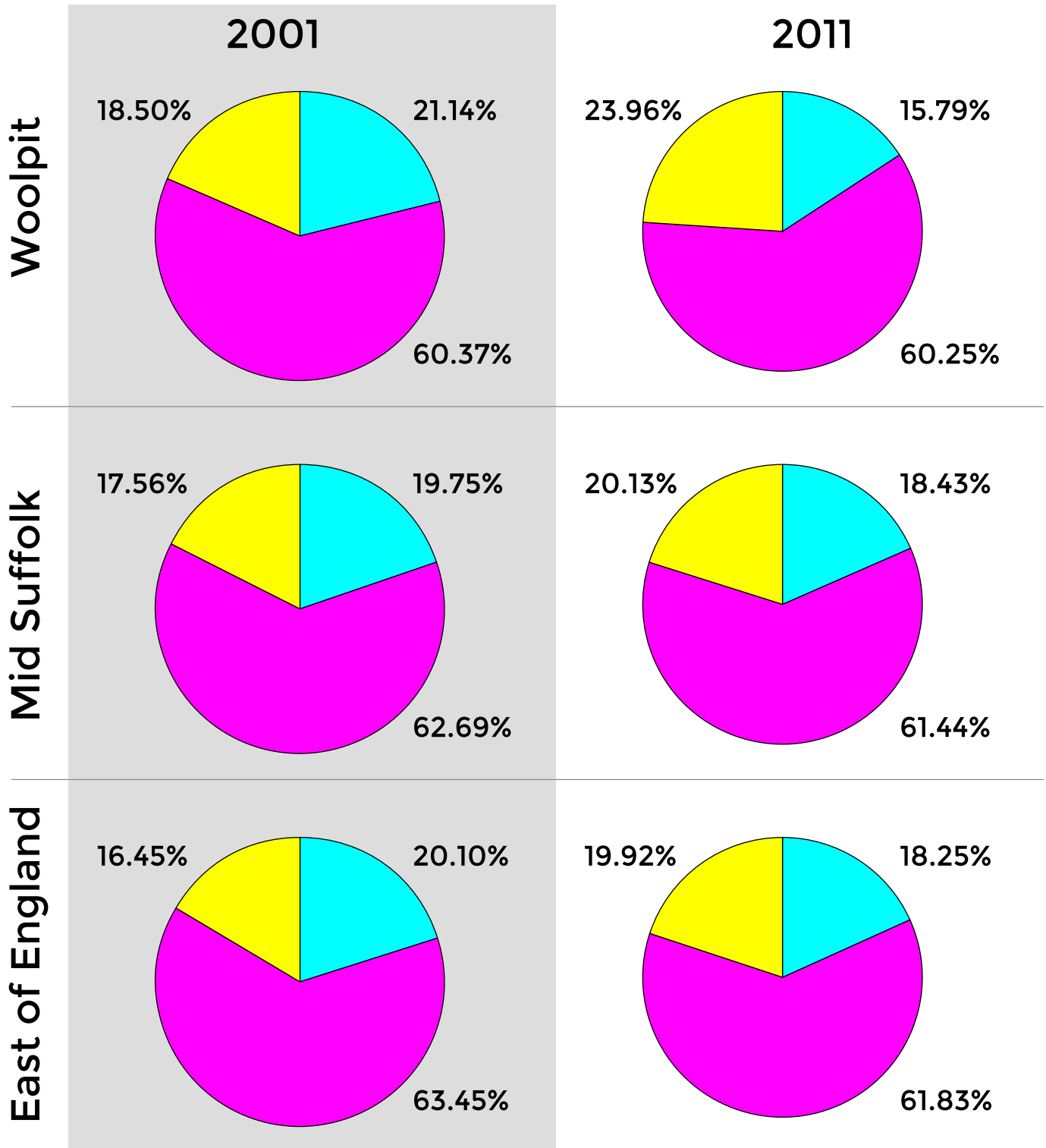
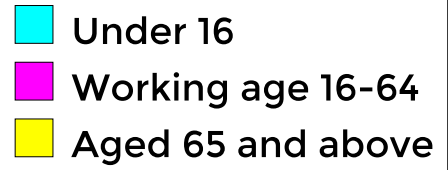
There are fewer adults under 65 living on their own in Woolpit than is the average in the district and in England generally, but more people over 65. This reflects our older age profile.

In 2001 the median age in Woolpit was 42; by 2011 it had increased to 47.
